**UTAH CONSTITUTIONAL REVISION COMMISSION SEEKS TWO
NEW MEMBERS TO START IMMEDIATELY**

The Utah Constitutional Revision Commission announces two immediate openings for citizen members. These are volunteer positions with no salary and a six-year term.

Application Process:

Interested persons may mail, fax, or email a resume with a cover letter to: Jerry D. Howe, Utah Constitutional Revision Commission, Utah State Capitol Complex, W210 House Building, Salt Lake City, UT 84114-5210; fax (801) 538-1712; email jdhowe@utah.gov. To be considered, resumes and letters must be received no later than August 31, 2007. A selection committee will review resumes and arrange interviews. Consideration will be given to achieving representation from major geographical areas in the state and an equal bipartisan representation.

Information about the Constitutional Revision Commission:

The Commission consists of 15 members, three appointed by the Governor, three appointed by the President of the Senate, and three appointed by the Speaker of the House. Those nine members select the remaining six members.

Commission meetings are held approximately six times per year: once on a Friday in February at noon and then usually the second Thursday of alternating months from May through November from 1:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m. Commission meetings are usually held in the House Building on capitol hill in Salt Lake City, although meetings may be held at other locations throughout the state.

The Commission's duties are to make a comprehensive examination of the Utah Constitution and make recommendations for changes to the Governor and the Legislature. Also, upon request of the Governor, legislative leaders, or a legislative sponsor, the Commission advises the Governor and Legislature on proposed constitutional amendments. See Utah Code Ann. § 63-54-105.
